IfATE Level 6 Standard Review....

- The Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education is delaying its decision on whether to remove the integrated degree from the popular digital solutions apprenticeship as it launches a wider review of its mandated qualifications policy.
- But the quango said today it is postponing the decision and will now conduct a "broader review of policy on degree apprenticeships" at level 6.
- In a statement the IfATE said: "We are listening to employers and taking time to review plans for an updated DTSP apprenticeship. We will conduct a broader review of policy on degree apprenticeships and take a look again at the DTSP standard in light of the review.
- "Students can continue to start on the existing DTSP apprenticeship and degree apprenticeships at level 6 will continue to play an important role in the overall programme."
- They added: "We are listening and taking the time to consider all of the different points of view here. We did not want to make a decision without doing that."
- There are 39 apprenticeship standards with an integrated degree which are currently available for delivery at the moment.

Student Number Controls

Apprenticeships

- For all practical purposes, apprenticeships will be excluded from SNCs.
- Apprenticeships are jobs with a sustained element of training, so this provision is
 delivered in conjunction with local employers, where the apprentice is employed.
 Relationships between these employers and providers are usually well established, so
 they are unlikely to be vulnerable to aggressive recruitment practices and pose little or
 no threat to the stability of the sector.
- However, despite apprentices being in full-time employment, they are sometimes also recorded as studying full-time in the Higher Education Students Early Statistics (HESES) data, which is used to calculate and monitor SNCs.
- For HESES20, OfS will provide guidance on how apprentices are recorded in the data return, which will allow all apprenticeship places to be identified.
- When monitoring potential recruitment above an SNC, a provider will not be considered to have exceeded it by virtue of the number of apprenticeship students it has.



<u>Update 24 06 20</u>

Subcontracting Declarations Final Deadline – including nil returns by Friday 3 July 2020.

- providers are required to make a revised declaration through Manage your education skills funding (MYESF) as and when any of their subcontracting relationships or values change.
- The current declarations relate to 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 non-levy and levy funded provision
- YOU MUST DO THIS EVEN IF YOU DON'T SUBCONTRACT simply post a nil return

Return of Subcontracting External Assurance Certificate for 2019 to 2020 - by 31 July 2020.

- providers are required to obtain an annual report from an external auditor if they have entered into subcontracts with an aggregate value of more than £100,000 each financial year for new apprenticeship starts.
- Providers must send a certificate to the ESFA each year to confirm this report has been received.
 Further information is available on the <u>providing external assurance on subcontracting</u> controls GOV.UK page.
- ESFA will not be taking compliance action where this date is not met.

- The LDM codes should be used for all learners where training has been affected by covid-19
- This applies to Provider who are in receipt of the Provider relief scheme and those who are not.

368 COVID-19 temporary or permanent withdrawals

For learners who have left their programme temporarily or permanently
without achieving due to COVID-19, due to Covid-19 after the 23rd of March
i.e. withdrawn or break in learning

369 COVID-19 new programme restarts

 For learners when they restart their programme and training recommences and they are now active in the ILR
