Asking Questions during the Session:

If you'd like to ask a question – type this into the question line at any time and we will raise these as soon as we can, or we will unmute you to ask your question live.

FORUM FORMAT:

The forum is a combination of presentations, live Q and A and discussion topics:

- **PRESENTATIONS:** You will be on mute during the presentation sections but just keep adding your questions via the question line and we will cover these in the Q and A, or unmute you to enable you to ask these live.

- **WRITTEN QUESTIONS:** When you type a question or add a written point into the question line, the webinar records this. This helps us see trends and group points together for you to raise in the open mic sections. Log everything if you can, and we will use this to keep a rolling Q and A and circulate a summary after the event.

FORUM SESSIONS: The forum sessions and Q and A will be 'open mic'. If you are in a quiet space, and you want to make a point or add to a previous question ask a question you can **click the 'raise hand' button** and unmute yourself and we will invite you to raise your point or question as soon as we can. If there is just too much background noise we might have to return to written questions only but we will make the sessions as interactive as possible.

- **POLLS:** We will run a series of quick polls during the session that you can participate in to give your views. Your views will be anonymous and only the aggregated answers will be shown
