

Background

- Originally being explored by QAA pilot activity pre-pandemic
- Consultation by IfATE in 2020 EQA rationalisation
- Underpinning arrangements developed over the course of 2021
- Translating pilot activity into an approach that works with regard to the EQA Framework and Manual, and works for a HE environment
- Minimising burden but ensuring stakeholder expectations are met
- OfS has retained oversight of all HE provision throughout



What is happening now?

- Publicly launched the handbook and materials
- Recruiting and training DQB assessors
- Engaging employer representatives
- Initial assessment activity (readiness check) over the summer with an initial small group of providers
- Wider roll-out in autumn (readiness checks and monitoring checks)



EQA method

1 Readiness check

 Readiness checks of providers by an assessment team to approve EPA delivery, the provider action plan and the arrangements for monitoring

2 EQA monitoring

- Ongoing monitoring by the DQB Officer to review progress
- EQA external assessor monitoring (typically the provider's external examiner) to assess delivery of the EPA
- Monitoring checks to assess delivery of the EPA and agree action plans

Reporting throughout to IfATE and OfS



Readiness check

- Desk based process
- Conducted by DQB Officer, DQB Assessor, Employer Representative
- Initially we will seek to do a whole provider at once to minimise burden – different approach for new standards
- Expect to draw upon materials already in existence beyond the readiness check document not expecting providers to create new information
- Assessing against IfATE specified requirements
- Will result in one of four judgements, and actions and recommendations



Monitoring Ongoing monitoring

- At least once a year per standard
- Looking at the actions and recommendations
- Changes to the External Assessor arrangements
- External Assessor report
- Can lead to changes to the overall monitoring arrangements



Monitoring

EQA External assessor monitoring

- EQA External Assessor = normally the external examiner
- Not the external assessor used for the EPA process
- Reporting requirements are likely to be similar to existing EE reporting arrangements (para 50 of guidance)
- Requirement to share information about the arrangements being put in place and on an ongoing basis



Monitoring

Monitoring check

- At least once every three years for each standard
- Different standards may operate to a different schedule on a risk based basis
- Self assessment required
- Visit required
- Results in a formal outcome, actions, and recommendations
- Considered by the OfS as evidence in relation to condition B4

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

Higher Level Skills – Reflections

- T levels, Applied Generals and the Technical Pathway
- Higher Technical Education (HTE) and Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs)
- Degree Apprenticeships
- Lifelong Loan Entitlement and RPL/RPEL/APEL
- Review of the Apprenticeship Levy
- Government Changes

Impact of the above on HE provision as a whole





T Levels, Applied Generals and the Technical Pathway

- Proposed Mainstream Offer at 16 18
- Some Opportunity for smaller Applied Generals to be combined with A Levels, but Applied Generals (e.g., BTEC and Cambridge Nationals) were threatened to become 'rare'...
- A coalition of 30 organisations undertaking on-going lobbying on the value of the Applied General – focus on choice, distinctiveness of Applied Generals, role in access and participation via The #ProtectStudentChoice campaign
- See recent HEPI report on value of Applied Generals HERE
- T Levels first cohorts in *construction*, *digital*, and *education and childcare* get their results on 'A level and T Level results day'
 - Communication and briefings forthcoming from DfE via UVAC





Higher Technical Education and HTQs

- Higher Technical Qualifications an IfATE Quality Mark for level 4 and 5 technical qualifications mapped to and approved against Occupational Standards
- Will HTQs grow?
 - Number Caps (on other types of provision)??
 - Financial Incentives/Disincentives for other provision??
 - Where will HTQs grow employer and individual demand, e.g., Health and Social Care?
- IfATE Approvals process mostly positive
- Competition with Ofqual regulated FE qualifications and issues of credit size
- £10m OU pilot to validate college delivery at Levels 4 and 5
- Quality Ofsted versus OfS/QAA? History repeating...?
- Articulation and progression with bachelor's degrees?





Degree Apprenticeships

- Degree Apprenticeships = a brilliant UK invention
- England Apprenticeships = an aspirational programme
- Degree Apprenticeships = Progression Routes strengthened
- Ministers' intentions = more HEIs delivering
- IfATE's Policy Refresh = a 'new' and strengthened DA brand
- Degree Apprenticeship Growth Plan = removing barriers to engagement and establishing the place for and role of targets

Lifelong Loan Entitlement and RPL

- 1st consultation The Lifelong Loan Entitlement (LLE): see UVAC's consultation response HERE
- See UUK's consultation response HERE

 - Our key messages:
 - 1. We are supportive of the new system and LLE ambition
 - Need a greater understanding of the level of demand for modular study and typical learner
 - New system must ensure articulation with degrees with modules that can build into a qualification
 - 4. Employer contribution and relevance is absent
 - 5. RPL and system of FE/HE credit transfer needs a new narrative
 - **NEW** Knowledge Network on national standards for RPL for health education

- 4. Avoiding a Focus on the Magic Bullet
- UVAC and CMI will be producing a full policy/position paper in August, ahead of the autumn statement


- Former Minister Donelan's ambition for the Lifelong Loan Entitlement: "Post-recovery Britain can become a skills powerhouse, with a further and higher education system that is accessible to all, and that acts as an engine for social mobility real social mobility which focuses on getting on as much as getting in" (2021)
- Universities ordered to set "ambitious targets" to boost the proportion of students studying degree apprenticeships
- DfE was exploring "financial incentives" to entice more universities to offer degree apprenticeships


