Modules

- 'micro-credential' or component of larger programme
- 'L@W' modules are negotiated around work projects/activities/ investigations
- can be supported by content-based modules

'L@W' modules

Address a practice issue

Negotiated and assessed in context

20-30 up to 60 credits

- *organisational change*
- *community and team development*
- *learning community*
- *cascade training*
- *business start-up & development*
- *tackle practical challenges*
- *improve systems & processes*
- *develop practice*

Form coherent package with L@W modules

Applied and assessed in context

Typically smaller

Can be in-company

- *learning from work*
- *practical research*
- *project planning*
- *reflection*
- *managing change*
- *process improvement*
- *substantive/technical topics*

Modules into programmes

L@W modules can be used within (or build to) various types of programme – apprenticeships, degrees with placements, executive/CPD degrees, fully negotiated programmes, short programmes etc. Any level but most likely to be 6/7.

RPL often important

(a) for access e.g. for top-up degree

(b) as a coherent part of the programme

- *part of apprenticeship or professional training*
- *work-based component of degree*
- *structured executive/CPD programmes – negotiated and applied in context*
- *'access' tool to transition to next level – FE to HE, degree to PQ, PQ to postgrad etc.*
- *experienced worker top-up e.g. L5 to degree, PGCert/Dip to M*
- *short custom programmes e.g. to meet specific business needs*
- *build on micro-credentials*
- *fully negotiated programmes*
